Becoming Buddhas

Last month, I spoke with you about becoming our foolish selves. This month I wish to speak with you about becoming Buddhas. We must accept our own limitations and be our foolish selves; - for the time being. However, in the long run, our objective is to become a sort of superhero, a Buddha.

At the end of our current lives, we will be transformed by our entry into the Buddha's Enlightened Pure Realm. We all get to be heroes in the future. We will be of great help to others, especially those who have been and are close to us. We will be empowered by the "bodies of boundlessness" which we then possess. In other words, the essential character of our embodiment as Buddhas will be Limitless potential.

How do you content yourself with becoming your foolish self while actually needing to become a Buddha? Trust. It's always been a matter of trust. There is a goodness we encounter in Pure Land Mahayana Buddhism. We can trust that com

passionate concern to pick us up and take us where we need to go; - eventually. For now, we must be content to be limited. and sometimes foolish. I find that humility helps. Humility is the necessary effect of a genuine commitment to equality. If we really care about others, they must be just as important as we are.



If others are just as important as you and I, how can we boost ourselves up on the high horse? How can we put on airs? But if we are cared for by the Awoken Subjectivity of Life Itself, how can we not trust that we will enter those heroic phases in our future lives? I am just a foolish, ignorant being; but I am of great concern to Amida Buddha, whom I trust to take care of my flowering into heroism in my next life. We will be heroic liberators one day. We are sorry not to be doing better, just now. The Buddha is not surprised by nor put off by our current weaknesses and foolishness. We will one day, lead others out of suffering, into goodness, into the Light.


