

## BEING HERE By Rev. Jundo Gregory Gibbs

In last month's Bussei Script I encouraged us all to remember that we're from here; - planet earth. Knowing that we are part of animal life on this pretty, but rather violent, little planet is important. Being here, embracing our status as he, she, and they, who are of the earth, who emerge as part of animal life on planet earth, must be our foundation.

The only way to realize that you are, in a very real sense, everywhere; - is to revel in having your feet planted in mother earth. As our hearts and minds are also planted in the Vow of Universal Liberation [Hon Gan], we are also everywhere. ... We are children of the earth who have connections, obligations, even alternate lives all across the universe.

In 1967 the late Jeff Beck wrote the song "Hi Ho Silver Lining," a critique of the uncritical, self-indulgent sub-culture ways of living that he saw amongst some of those who others called hippies. That song includes the line, "You're everywhere and nowhere baby, that's where you're at." Well, ... that's just what we don't mean. Those who believe that they already are the Universe, or that they are (already, as they are) everywhere are, actually nowhere. ... Nowhere in the negative sense. The fact that we have identities spanning more than one biological lifetime, the fact that our universe would likely be a part of a multiverse, is just an aspect of the complexity Buddhists discover in the real world. This is a complexity that can be seen from a firm stance on the surface of our home planet. You have to actually be here and feel the joy and limitations of being situated, before you



can feel you are everything, everywhere, all at once.

If we want to feel love and connection broadly, it can only be done from standing just where we actually are. So, as I urged us all last time, be an earthling. But also, be a nembutsu follower. As those who say the nembutsu and rely on the enacting of the Vow to soothe, liberate and inspire all; - we have the confidence to move forward in our lives. Take a few moments each day to say, "Namo Amida Butsu" aloud. When you have down time during the day, but are in public, let "Namu Amida Butsu" run through your mind. Wherever it is when you are saying, or silently holding the Nembutsu in mind, be there. Always be here; -amidst the Buddha's compassion, hearing the Nembutsu.
