

Treasure is Where you Find It Rev. Jundo Gregory Gibbs

Nobody told me there'd be days like these. [Lots of allusions in this month's article]. Typhoons threatening San Diego, dodging us for the most part, but threatening; wildfires



Last month I spoke about how qualities emerge from systems. Consciousness from our bodily processes. Discrimination emerges from systemic societal ignorance. From Buddhist tradition can emerge non-discriminatory, affectionate recognition of one another. This is the greatest of values for genuine persons: "Hi, I'm here." "Hey, you're here too, great!"

One of the teachers I studied Zen Buddhism with a bit, Robert Aitken Roshi, told a story about meeting with his revered teacher, Yasutani Roshi. Yasutani made a rhetorical

comment, "I wonder what is most important in human life." Aitken was expecting an answer like "Buddha-nature", "emptiness" or "dependent co-arising." Yasutani answered his own question saying, "I suppose that friendship is the most important thing in human life." Family and friends are those who make my life warm, enjoyable and satisfying. They are my greatest treasure.

Most of you have probably seen the Calvin and Hobbes cartoon that gives this essay its title. Copyright considerations force me to retell the strip without cartoon images: Frame #1 Calvin digging a hole in the backyard. Frame #2 Hobbes asks, "What are you doing?" Frame #3 Calvin replies, "Digging for buried treasure." Frame #4 Hobbes asks, "What have you found so far?" Frame #5 Calvin replies, "A few dirty rocks, a weird root and some disgusting grubs." Frame #6 Hobbes responds ironically "On your first try." Final Frame: Calvin guilelessly explains, "There's treasure everywhere!"

If we miss seeing it in the sunset or feeling it in the next gentle breeze; surely, we can find treasure in our family and friends. Recognizing the goodness that makes us care for them, we learn to see the integrity of all things. Calvin is right. There's treasure everywhere.
