Inclusivity Includes Exclusion Rev. Jundo Gregory Gibbs

The Buddha's Compassion covers every part of the Universe, excluding not even the smallest nanoparticle. But the Buddha and his students still say "No" to all forms of violence. We exclude from our communities those who advocate violence. I had an opportunity to speak with a news reporter about our tradition about a year ago. I told her that, so far as Jodo Shinshu Buddhism is concerned, "We respect persons of all races, of all ethnicities, of all sexual orientations; ... all persons of good will."

We cannot welcome those of ill will, into our communities. We do not include people who promote violence in our communities. This is not because we are exclusive. It is because we apply wisdom as well as compassion in our decision making. Everyone is welcome to join our sangha, to become part of our community, if they can be non-violent and accepting of others.

In the long run, we hope to include everyone in the Buddhist community. For the immediate time being, we must exclude: Racists, Sexists, those who deny our responsibility to protect our environment, ... persons of ill will. This is only paradoxical at a verbal level. You do not actually exclude anyone by saying, "You are very welcome here as long as you are not violent, and as long as you are respectful of everyone else."

We must, and will, do what we can to make others want to be included in our Buddhist communities. Nonetheless, we cannot accommodate racism or sexism and we will not accept a suggested violent solution to any of our current difficulties. Those who embrace violence and prejudice cannot fit into our communities, comfortably. Without change, we would not be comfortable with them; and I doubt they would be that com-



fortable socializing with us. We still have to deal with them in the larger communities that we participate in. Our Buddhist community, our Sangha, is, nonetheless, limited to the peaceful and respectful.

One day, perhaps, our limited (for now) inclusivity and non-violence may spread. One day we will be able to share this world with billions of humans who are inclusive Buddhists, accepting Christians, open-minded Atheist-humanists, broadminded Muslims, tolerant Hindus, welcoming Baha'i, peaceful practitioners of Santeria, etc. We and our fellow community members must interact with persons of all types, and we must do so as wisely and kindly as possible. For now, however, we must content ourselves to include in our community, only, but all, persons of goodwill. Despite the harshness of these times, I think that will add up to a lot of people.

2024-2025 Academic Scholarship Applications Coming Soon

It's already that time of year! The Temple is offering two types of scholarships to applicants who are children or grandchildren of Temple members, or dues-paying members themselves.

Two memorial scholarships will be available. They are named after members who helped the Temple grow and thrive in the Post-War period, both of whom passed away far too soon in the mid-1990s.

For students entering college: The Ben Honda Memorial Graduating High School Graduate Scholarship is a one-page online form

For students beyond freshman year: The Tetsuyo Kashima Memorial Continuing Education Scholarship application includes a one-page online form and an informal essay requirement.

SIGNUPS CONTINUE FOR IMPERIAL VALLEY BUS OUTING

The connection between the Buddhist Temple of San Diego and the Imperial Valley, east of San Diego County, plays an important role in Jodo Shinshu history.

In 1948, when the El Centro Buddhist Church closed its doors, the church donated its center altar of Amida Buddha to BTSD. Around 1960, a monument (irehai) was erected at the Brawley cemetery in memory of the church members formerly of the Brawley Buddhist Church. For over 60 years, BTSD ministers have provided spiritual support for the Buddhist families in the agricultural region by conducting cemetery services in Calexico, El Centro and Brawley.

BTSD hopes that many from the Sangha will take the opportunity to participate in this day-long experience and join the ministerial team at the cemetery services and visit the former home of the El Centro Buddhist Church. After lunch, the group will visit the Japanese Gallery at the Pioneers Museum in Imperial.

BTSD plans to charter a bus for the visit. The cost will be \$25 per person for the bus and \$5-\$6 admission for the museum. The bus fee for registered students will be subsidized by the Dharma School program. If a minimum of 35 passengers for the bus is not reached, carpools will be arranged.

Reservations for the outing will continue to be accepted until May 15.

Departure from the temple will be at 7 a.m. The expected time of return is 5 p.m. Activities are planned for the bus ride and snacks will be provided.
